# Spring in your Garden

- Top dress "Wormswork Composite mix" at the rate of 250 grams per square metre over **flowering bulb beds**, as they flower or just when they finish flowering. This is your organic buffer for nutrient exchange and the worms have loaded it with micro-organisms that accelerate nutrient breakdown, assuring you get good flower formation on next year's daffodils, hyacinths, and tulips, provided they are growing in full sun.

- The snap-on handy 2-litre concentrate of "Wormswork spray on for **Lawns**" is a great stimulant and mobile organic buffer, that breaks the non-wetting cycle of dry thatch lawns and the micro-organisms have a catalytic effect on nutrient uptake.

- Use "Wormswork spray on for Lawns" in conjunction with "Wormswork all purpose liquid" for strengthening the root system in early spring and late autumn, when soil temperatures fall.

- When direct sowing **carrots, parsnips, radishes, beans and lettuce**, make an Impression with a rake handle as your furrow, then sow seed and top dress the row with "Wormswork Composite mix". This aids water penetration, nutrient uptake and gets your seed off to a great start.



- Spread "Wormswork Composite mix" at the rate of 250 grams per square metre over any **garden beds** for bedding plants such as Petunias, Marigolds, Cosmos, Gomphrena, Impatiens and Verbena.

- In late spring foliar spray with "Wormswork spray for **Garden Plants**", as a drought proofing measure. This is best done in the evening after a warm day. Keep the spray container moving and be amazed at the results.

- When you trench your **citrus** for feeding them in November add "Wormswork Composite mix" at the rate of 250 grams per 2 metres of trench, then backfill with pea straw and add your water soluble nutrient to the trench. Repeat in February and May.

- Top-dress all established **roses** with 250 grams of "Wormswork Composite mix" in October, so a 25 kg bag will do 100 plants; as the first flush of spring nutrients will have been used up. Spread the "Wormswork Solids" to 30cm from the stems. Avoid digging under roses as the disturbance causes root suckers form the rootstocks, which reduce the vigour of your flowering roses.

- Bring your **indoor plants** outside in a sheltered spot and spray to run-off with "Wormswork Indoor Pot Plant and Leaf spray". Although it has no odour, make sure the plants have dripped dry before relocating indoors

- Add "Wormswork Composite mix" at the rate of 250 grams per 20cm pot to all container-grown plants as the **potting** media is rather sterile and the micro-organisms in "Wormswork Solids" is a great organic buffer as well as a stunning catalysts to aid nutrient uptake.

- Top dress "Wormswork Composite mix" at the rate of 500 grams per 3 metre tall **Camellia** bush or 250 grams on a hedged or espaliered Sasangua Camellia while flowering, so next year's buds develop fully.

- Start dosing your **hydrangeas** with bluing or pinking agents, depending on your preference and add 250 grams of "Wormswork Composite mix" to each bush at the same time. On heavy clay soils add gypsum at 300 grams per bush and lightly scarify it in. It works in hours!

- Foliar spray "Wormswork spray for Garden Plants" to all summer **flowering bedding** plants and perennials at night for maximum nutrient uptake and fungal resistance.

- Add "Wormswork Composite mix" to any potting media for **repotting**, so that 5 volumes of media to one of "Wormswork Composite mix" will not only retain more water, but also aid nutrient uptake and drought proof your plants in the warm days ahead in summer
